Undergraduate Degree Programs at The College of New Jersey

Degree Requirements: Degree programs are composed of three parts: College Core (general education) requirements, major requirements, and electives. No student may graduate with fewer than 32 course units (=128 semester hours).

Course Unit Definition: The College of New Jersey (TCNJ) is on a course unit system. The typical undergraduate degree program at the College is 32 course units (with the exception of Engineering and Accountancy). A recommended academic load for the majority of students during the traditional Fall and Spring semester would be four course units over eight semesters. A course unit represents the equivalent of four credit hours.

The Elementary Education, Early Childhood Education, Education of the Handicapped, and Education of the Deaf and Hardof-Hearing sequences and all secondary education programs fall into the category of "dual majors," meaning that another program must be attached for it to be viable. The liberal arts or science content discipline is considered the first major for all secondary sequences. The education major is considered the first major for Elementary Education, Early Childhood Education, Education of the Handicapped, and Education of the Deaf and Hard-of-Hearing sequences. Note: There is no state- or TCNJ-approved secondary major; a dual major with secondary education must be understood as classifying secondary education as an 'attached' program, and not as a stand-alone approved major.
