

Environmental Sustainability Education Minor

The minor in Environmental Sustainability Education is a five-course interdisciplinary program grounded in teaching and learning. The program considers learning from all angles, both inside and outside the classroom, and prepares teachers and other educators to teach for sustainability within the current curricular guidelines and standards. The minor includes three courses held in the School of Education exploring environmental sustainability from the perspective of the sciences, social sciences, arts, and humanities, along with two content enriching courses selected by advisement. The program concludes with an independent study in which students can create curricula, conduct research, or engage in service related to environmental sustainability education.

Three courses and an independent study are required:

- ESE/ELE 100: Environmental Sustainability in Education- An Introduction
- MST 203: Environmental Sciences for Educators
- ESE/ELE 220: Sustainability & Society

One of the two remaining courses must be at the 300 or 400 level.
