Law, Politics, and Philosophy, the interdisciplinary prelaw minor, exposes students to the study of law from a variety of fields including political science, philosophy, criminology, history, and economics.. The minor provides students with broad exposure to legal study to give students a greater appreciation for and understanding of the law and different approaches to studying law and courts. The minor requires students to take challenging courses outside their major and includes rigorous training in the analytic and writing skills that prepare them for success on the Law School Aptitude Test (LSAT) and in law school.
